Topic outline (in teaching order)

Topic	Content	Teaching Time (estimated)
Media & Entertainment Film Study	Talking about media & entertainment. Describe Japanese cultural ceremonies in context, and share opinions and perspectives.	6 weeks
Work & Employment	Talking about work and employment in Japan. Describe processes of finding a job, discuss and make comparisons about job expectations and job application processes in Japan and NZ.	5 weeks
Travel & customs	Talk about travel and what life is like living in Japan as an exchange student. Talk about seasons and cultural activities related to the seasons. Discuss potential problems and difficulties, opportunities and share advice with one another.	5 weeks
Society & Environment	Talk about societal and environmental issues faced by Japan and New Zealand. Discuss potential reasons and solutions, share perspectives.	9 weeks
Future Planning	Review the topics as a whole while talking about planning for the future and what to do after graduation.	5 weeks
Literary Review/Film Study	Listening and reading practice to help prepare for the exams	5 weeks

- All topics provide a context for the internally assessed standards 3.3 (interaction) and 3.5 (Writing)
- Stimulus topic in 3.2 (speech) will be related to a social or environmental issue and links to the fourth topic.
